We meet for practice sessions before the actual meet for anyone who wants to and is able to attend. Currently, we are meeting in room 407. Usually we travel to other schools for meets but this year is still up in the air with the current climate and bussing issues.

Math Madness (Advisor: Mrs. McGreevy)

Math Madness is where students who love math meet weekly to work on challenging math problems on-line. You play with students from across the nation on 7-8 questions in a fall league which ends late December. After a few practice rounds and qualifying rounds, we have brackets similar to March Madness. There is a \$20 fee to play for the year which includes a pizza party in the spring.

Military History and Leadership (Advisor: Mr. Marra)

This club provides students interested in military history opportunities to enhance and enrich their learning beyond the broad overviews of armed conflict in the current curriculum. This club also provides leadership lessons and opportunities for students to develop and enhance their own personal growth and leadership skills. Activities include reading and discussion circles, battle-analysis presentations, film critiques, book reviews, guest speaker presentations, and participation in various veteran/military-based community service projects.

Model United Nations (Advisor: Mr. Lloyd)

Designed for anyone interested in developing their skills in collaboration, public speaking and group problem solving. Involves preparing for two conferences in which the proceedings of the United Nations are recreated, and High School students from across NY meet at Hilton HS & St. John Fisher College to find creative solutions to many of the pressing global issues of our day.

Musician's club is a percussion ensemble that performs in 3 concerts per year.

National Honor Society (Advisors: Mrs. Laistner, Mrs. McGreevy)

NHS is the nation's premier organization established to recognize outstanding high school students. NHS serves to recognize those students who have demonstrated excellence in the areas of scholarship, service, leadership and character. Eligible students are invited to apply for NHS in the fall of their junior year. Students interested being a part of NHS need to have an overall GPA of 90% and should be able to demonstrate how they have excelled in character, leadership and service throughout their years in high school.

Outdoor Conservation Club (Advisor: Mr. Pacitto)

The club is an opportunity for students to learn about and experience the sport of fishing. We plan to organize outings over the winter months, while visiting various locations to fish during the fall and spring.

Ranger Cub House (Advisor: Mr. Buttaro)

The Ranger Cub House is the student run school store for Spencerport High School. The store is considered a Business Lab where they demonstrate their understanding of business concepts in an authentic setting. Business students go through the job search process to work in the store, including filling out a job application, sending references and completing a job interview. Students learn the ins and outs of running a small business including customer service, inventory, payroll, accounting, marketing and management. We have student officers including a Manager, Assistant Manager, Secretary and Treasurer. The store sells school event tickets, snacks, drinks, and school supplies. The Ranger Cub House is currently open before school and during lunches.

R.C. Club (Advisor: Mr. Pacitto)

The purpose of R.C. Club is to promote and encourage the construction, design and building of radio controlled model vehicles. It is also used to promote fellowship among radio controlled modelers by participating in this club.

Combining the excitement of sport with the rigors of science and technology. We call FIRST Robotics Competition the ultimate Sport for the Mind. High-school student participants call it "the hardest fun you'll ever have." Under strict rules, limited time and resources, teams of students are challenged to raise funds, design a team "brand," hone teamwork skills, and build and program industrial-size robots to play a difficult field game against like-minded competitors. It's as close to real-world engineering as a student can get.

The New York State Seal of Biliteracy (NYSSB) recognizes high school graduates who have attained a high level of proficiency in listening, speaking, reading, and writing in one or more languages, in addition to English. The intent of the NYSSB is to encourage the study of languages; identify high school graduates with language and biliteracy skills for employers; provide universities with additional information about applicants seeking admission; prepare students with twenty-first century skills; recognize the value of foreign and native language instruction in schools; and affirm the value of diversity in a multilingual society.
