Presidential Awards

For Outstanding Academic Excellence:

The Presidential Award for Outstanding Academic Excellence encourages students to achieve high academic standards by rewarding scholars for their academic efforts and success. To be eligible for this award, graduating seniors must meet the minimum requirements of a grade point average of at least a 3.5 on a 4.0 scale, and a score of 90 or better on the ELA exam and on at least one Math exam.



For Outstanding Academic Achievement:

The purpose of the Presidential Award for Educational Achievement is to recognize students who show outstanding educational growth, improvement, commitment or intellectual development in their academic subjects. It is meant to encourage and reward students who work hard, give their best effort in school and demonstrate a commitment to learning.



High Honor for Juniors & Seniors:

Academic Certificates are awarded to Junior students (and some Seniors) who have consistently been on High Honor roll for 11 quarters. They receive an Academic Window Cling.
